### REMINDER - BOTTOM STAFF CAR PARK

Just a reminder that the car park at the bottom of Grantlea Drive is for Staff only. We also ask that Parents and Students do not use this entrance before or after school. This car park is also used by the school bus in the afternoons and some safety concerns have been raised with people walking through the car park at this time.

### **REQUIREMENTS FOR USING CHILD RESTRAINTS**

These are the legal requirements.

### Children under 2 years old

You should keep your baby in a rear-facing child restraint in the back seat until at least 2 years old, depending on their height and weight. Check your child restraint instruction manual for its height and weight information.

### Children under 7 years old

If the child is under 7 years old you must use an approved child restraint, appropriate for their age and size. They must not travel in the vehicle if you can't put them in an approved child restraint. The vehicle's seatbelt on its own isn't an approved child restraint.

### Children 7 years old

If the child is 7 years old you must use an approved child restraint appropriate for their age and size. If there isn't one available in the vehicle, you're required to use a seatbelt. However, if your child is under 148cm tall, the safe option is to use an approved child restraint. Children 8 to 14 years old

Children 8 to 14 years old must use a seatbelt and sit in the back seat if one is available.

### Children over 14 years old

Children over 14 years old must use a seatbelt. Sit children in the back seat A child under 15 years old should sit in the back seat, unless those seats are occupied by children under 15, or the vehicle doesn't have any back seats. Sitting in the back seat helps protect young bodies against crash forces.


The Grantlea Downs disco will be held on Thursday 29th August 2024

We appreciate your help!


### On the day:

Most concerns can be resolved informally by discussions with the people concerned.




This flowchart aligns with the school's Concerns and Complaints policy and procedures.
