Our breakfast club, which was re-established last term is running really well with a number of children coming along each morning. However, we would be grateful for any parent support to help us run it in the mornings, even if it was just helping one morning a week. It runs from 8:30 until 9am. Things don't always go as planned at school. From time to time, we see stress responses from our students. Yes, stress response, as in the body's response to stress. This is the term that has replaced 'behaviour' and is backed by modern science.

Our understanding of learning, how the brain works, and the importance of connections and relationships has evolved since we were all students at school.

One of the things we've probably all experienced, either directly or indirectly, is someone 'misbehaving' or responding to stress. When something happened, it was always followed up by a consequence. Back in the day it was largely punitive, so in other words the student was punished.

Fast forward to the present day, and we still follow up incidents with a consequence and more often than not, that consequence is a conversation. This doesn't mean we let kids get away with it, or let kids do whatever they want. It simply means we understand that underneath the stress response lies what is really going on. Because we understand stress and the impact on the brain and body so much better nowadays it means we can meet everyone with compassion and understanding, rather than just punishment - which doesn't work, and has never worked.

This response (rather than a reaction) is designed so that everyone involved gets to walk away with their mana.

Timaru Mighty Willows: Family and Educators Session- Wednesday Ist May at Grantlea Downs School 7pm – 9pm



Mighty Willows aims to help parents / caregivers / teachers to develop an understanding of children's responses (also known as behaviour, but we don't focus on that!) from the inside out - we discuss the nervous system and how this plays a role in responses and explore ways to better understand and respond to underlying needs.

This workshop is a condensed version of the Knowing Your Child module. We will explore the root causes of behaviours and get curious about what uses up the child's (or the adult's) energy (or spoons) during the day. We will discuss how to co-regulate with children.

You will leave the workshop with 2 documents to begin making changes at home or school:

- "Spoons Profile" outlining what is using your child's energy each day
- "Spoon Savers" document outlining ideas to help regulate your child

GRANTLEA DOWNS SCHOOL OUT OF ZONE ENROLMENTS TERM 3 & 4 2024

The Board invites applications from parents who wish to enrol their child at Grantlea Downs for Term 3 & 4 2024.

Enrolment at the school is governed by an enrolment scheme, details of which are available from the school office.

Applications for out-of-zone places are now being invited for those students who will become eligible for enrolment during the period 22 July to 17 December 2024. We currently have places available in Year 0, Year 1, Year 2, Year 3, Year 5, Year 6 and Year 7. The exact number of places will depend on the number of applications received from students who live within the school zone.

The deadline for receipt of applications for out-of-zone places is **Tuesday 7 May 2024**.
