Tena koutou katou

One of the things that all schools, including Grantlea Downs, is continuing to focus on this term is attendance. You will hear us talking about it with you, and with our students. It is regularly discussed in our team meetings as we focus on ways to make sure our tamariki are engaged in school.

If a student misses one day of school every two weeks, they miss more than a whole year of school by 16 years of age. As a parent or caregiver, you, alongside our school, play a key role in building strong habits of regular school attendance. All students are legally required to attend school every day and it is a shared responsibility to make sure students attend and engage in learning from when they first start school. You must let the school know if your child is going to be absent or intends being absent for a portion of the school term for whatever reason, like a tangi or a medical procedure. Family holidays or taking time off for extracurricular activities (not organised by school) are not acceptable reasons for being absent.

If you're struggling at home to get your child to school, talk to us! Our school is committed to supporting your child to attend school and building a culture that fosters excellence by having

- School staff who have strong relationships with students and whānau.
- A school culture that recognises your child and your family for who they are, where they come from and who they want to be.
- A school community that does everything to make sure students are at school, and they are participating, and progressing their education.

If you require further information or assistance please do not hesitate to ask.

Last week we had a very successful Tsunami Hikoi where we evacuated the whole school to Marchwiel Park. Before we left, the school had a Shake Out (earthquake drill) where the children practised the Drop, Cover, Hold method. School Sprints and relays were also held last week.

As I am writing the newsletter, it made me think of the staff we have at school that make our school the great place that it is. I would like to take this opportunity to thank the staff that plan all the activities, teach the children, keep our school clean and tidy, look after children in the sickbay, ensure we have a beautiful school to learn and play in, feed the children, greet visitors at reception and make sure that we comply with all the rules and regulations. It is always nice to acknowledge what people do, so thank you.

Thank you to those that filled out the recent Health Survey. This will help when planning our Health units in the future.

This week the Opihi Team are off to the Opihi Farmyard and the Waipopo Team are going to the Waimate Events Centre as their outdoor education trip.

SCHOOL DONATIONS – GOVERNMENT SCHEME

The Grantlea Downs School Board, at their meeting in June, decided to continue to 'opt in' to the Government Donations Scheme. By our school 'opting in' this means that we will not ask parents for school donations **except** for overnight camps (as per the Education (School Donations) Amendment Bill).

What is **not covered** by School Donations **and is <u>still</u> payable to school** is the following:

- Any voluntary stationery e.g., new entrant stationery packs.
- The 'take home' component of TTEC
 (Technology fees) please note you have
 agreed to pay these fees on your enrolment
 form when you enrol your child.
- Weekend or after school sports fees e.g., netball, touch rugby, basketball, softball/t-ball etc
- Visiting drama or music groups (please note we currently do not ask for payment for this)
- After-hours/lunchtime culture activities
- After-hours/lunchtime sports activities
- School uniform

In addition to the government donations scheme, our students are fortunate to be receiving free fruit in schools and free school lunches – not all schools receive these benefits.

Please note: if at any time the government does not offer the School Donations – Government scheme, or the Board decides to opt out of this scheme, then donations will need to be requested to provide the opportunities that your child currently receives.


